Centro's Workforce Development team promoted economic empowerment through equity by forging new paths, growing entrepreneurs, and training the next generation with...

- ▶ 644 total ESL students studying five different levels of English.
- 10 new, Centro-trained medical interpreters!
 During the practicum portion of their training, our interpreters provided 753 patients with 1,143 hours of free interpretation.
- 139 aspiring entrepreneurs receiving 750 hours of business coaching and establishing 15 growing businesses.




