Centro Hispano de East Tennessee is a hub where Latino families learn, grow, and thrive. Our culturally grounded programs support people of all ages through education, connection, and opportunity.

Through this work we elevate the presence, contributions, and voices of Latino families.

## MISSION AND VISION

As the region's leading Latino-serving organization, Centro Hispano de East Tennessee connects, celebrates, and lifts up our community, and we envision an East Tennessee in which all Latinos can thrive culturally, educationally, and economically.

Our mission is to promote empowerment and civic participation through education, workforce development, youth and family engagement, and community-strengthening initiatives.

# THE WORK THAT MOVES OUR COMMUNITY FORWARD



Centro Hispano strengthens our community by delivering essential resources, uplifting youth and families, and expanding workforce opportunities. Together, these areas of impact create the foundation for opportunity, belonging, and long-term success for Latino families across our East Tennessee.

## COMMUNITY RESOURCES

Our Community Resources team helps our community access the services they need, including legal support, health care, and safe housing. We focus on building a healthier and more resilient community by strengthening connections, expanding access, and promoting equity.

### LEGAL SUPPORT

In response to rising concerns about discriminatory national policies, Centro Hispano strengthened its legal support services in late 2024 and early 2025 by expanding access to trusted information, offering nine legal clinics, and providing "Know Your Rights" and family preparedness workshops that helped families safeguard their future.

### Our Impact

- **93** families supported in creating Power of Attorney documents, giving them a clear plan in case of unexpected emergencies.
- **9** workshops hosted to help families understand their rights and access trusted legal resources.

## MATERNAL HEALTH

The Maternal Health program supports new and expecting parents as they prepare for childbirth, navigate postpartum challenges, and build strong, informed caregiving practices.

### Our Impact

- **133** new and expecting parents attended maternal health workshops to educate themselves, find support, and strengthen their networks.
- **34** caregivers enrolled in our **Cuna Program** class series, focused on prenatal, postnatal, and infant care.
- **12** postpartum sessions offered guidance and education for mothers navigating the first days of motherhood.



In 2024-2025 Centro Hispano saw a **136% increase** in program participants.

## COMMUNITY WELLNESS

In East Tennessee, 29 percent of Latinos lack health insurance, creating major barriers to care. Our Community Wellness programs help families understand the health conditions that disproportionately affect our community and the steps they can take to prevent them. Participants learn how nutrition, movement, and mental well-being contribute to longer, healthier lives.

### Our Impact

- **75** community members participated in Bienestar workout sessions, finding joy, hope, and strength through guided movement and community support.
- **30** Bienestar participants practiced healthier habits and worked to increase their metabolic health through regular group sessions and wellness coaching.
- **568** households supported by providing **2,900** diapers, administering **310** vaccines, and distributing **12,625** pounds of food to our food insecure community.

## HEALTH OUTREACH

Centro Hispano's Community Resources department partners with trusted local institutions to host quarterly health fairs that are free and open to the community. These events increase access to primary care, mammograms, vaccines, and essential health information for Latino families.

### Our Impact

- **4** certified Community Health Workers provided direct outreach and support across Centro Hispano's programs.
- **305** community members received vaccines.
- **891** individuals accessed primary care appointments, dental check-ups, fresh produce, and more.



### IMPACT STORY

#### A Healthier Future for Latino Families

Two years ago, a Centro Hispano participant joined our wellness program determined to improve her prediabetic and high blood pressure levels. She showed remarkable discipline, rarely missing a session. At graduation, she shared something deeply personal: she had hoped to have another baby, but her doctor had explained that her health made another pregnancy difficult and unsafe. With Centro Hispano's guidance, this mom committed to changing that future. By the end of the program, her numbers had improved significantly. Even more meaningful, she was pregnant. Today, she brings her healthy baby back to Centro Hispano, a living reminder of how community-based support can transform health and shape what families believe is possible.



# YOUTH AND FAMILY *Engagement*

At Centro Hispano de East Tennessee we provide enriching, supportive, and culturally affirming opportunities for families and children through stronger foundations, youth and caregiver empowerment, and community building.

Centro Hispano's Youth and Family Engagement programs are designed to meet Latino families where they are, providing safe spaces for learning, growth, and connection.

AREAS OF IMPACT



## EARLY CHILDHOOD EDUCATION AND AFTERSCHOOL

Knox County Schools serves more than four thousand English Language Learners, most of whom come from Spanish-speaking homes. Approximately 31 percent of these students are showing growth in English proficiency. Those whose parents do not speak English at home often face lower reading and math scores, along with added social and emotional challenges.

Centro Hispano's early childhood and afterschool programs help close these gaps by offering culturally responsive learning environments, academic support, and strong caregiver partnerships. Through supportive relationships and family advocacy, Centro Hispano strengthens academic, social, and emotional skills while building resilience and reducing risk factors for Latino youth.

### Our Impact

- **233** total students engaged across early childhood and afterschool programs.
- **70** children ages 0-5 participated in early childhood education programs with high-quality, literacy-focused environments.
- **163** youth ages 4-14 accessed safe, supportive spaces after school and during the summer.
- **87%** of students demonstrated increased reading proficiency across four afterschool sites: Belle Morris, Lonsdale, Westview, and Norwood.
- **112** parents and caregivers supported through family education programs, including Familias Fuertes, Juntos Aprendemos Mejor, and Padres Empoderados.
- **83%** of Familias Fuertes participants reported improved family relationships through this culturally responsive substance-misuse prevention program.

## POSTSECONDARY ACCESS

Centro Hispano's Postsecondary Access program helps Latino youth connect education to long-term opportunity. Students gain the knowledge, skills, and support needed to pursue higher education, explore career paths, and build financial stability. Through partnerships with local schools, colleges, and workforce programs, they receive college readiness workshops, financial aid guidance, mentorship, and career exposure. Integrated financial literacy and social-emotional learning prepare students not just to access higher education, but to thrive in it and beyond.

### Our Impact

- **52** postsecondary events held, including college fairs, student panels, workshops, classes, and career exploration opportunities.
- **625** students served throughout the year across high schools, community colleges, and Centro Hispano-led programming.
- **394** hours of individualized coaching provided by our Postsecondary Access Coordinator to students and their families.



### IMPACT STORY

#### How Centro's College Fair Opened the Door to Camila's Success

Camila's journey began at Centro's College Fair, where she met a University of Tennessee representative who encouraged her to apply to the Business Education for Talented Students (BETS), a 10-day summer program that introduces underrepresented high school rising seniors to the field of business. That single moment led to scholarships, admission to the College of Business, and exclusive career opportunities she never imagined.

As part of our mission to empower the Latino community, Centro Hispano provides post-secondary guidance and resources for all students to reach their full potential. For nearly a decade, our college fairs have opened doors like the one that changed Camila's future.



## WORKFORCE DEVELOPMENT

Centro Hispano promotes economic empowerment by providing Latino community members with language skills, vocational training, financial tools, and business support. Through education, coaching, and career pathways, we help families strengthen their economic independence and access greater opportunities.

## MEDICAL INTERPRETERS PROGRAM

Centro Hispano's Medical Interpreter Program trains bilingual community members to serve as skilled medical interpreters, ensuring that Latino patients receive accurate and compassionate care. This program strengthens health equity while opening new career pathways.

### Our Impact

- **2,952** patients served through Centro Hispano-supported interpretation.
- **2,615** hours of no-cost medical interpretation provided across local clinics and hospitals.
- **19** trained interpreters in East Tennessee.

## FINANCIAL EDUCATION PROGRAM

Financial education is essential for strengthening financial stability. Centro Hispano's bilingual financial counseling and workshops help families build credit, budget effectively, and work toward major life milestones, including homeownership.

Through a quarterly homeownership series offered in partnership with **HomeSource East Tennessee**, bilingual financial counselors guide participants through the steps of preparing for mortgage approval.

Monthly financial workshops, offered in partnership with local banks and financial institutions, cover budgeting, savings, debt management, and credit building.

### Our Impact

- **142** community members received individualized financial counseling.
- **48** community members completed homeownership education.
- **52** tax returns prepared in collaboration with AARP.

## ENGLISH AS A SECOND LANGUAGE PROGRAM

Centro Hispano's English as a Second Language (ESL) program offers nine levels of English classes ranging from basic communication to college and career readiness. These classes strengthen literacy, build employability, and support a stronger workforce for Latino families.

### Our Impact

- **256** ESL students learning English, gaining language skills that open doors to education and employment.
- **86%** of students improved their ability to communicate effectively in English.

## GRANDES SUEÑOS EN PEQUEÑAS EMPRESAS PROGRAM

Centro Hispano's small business development program supports aspiring entrepreneurs through coaching, workshops, and one-on-one mentorship. From idea to launch, participants receive guidance on business planning, marketing, financial management, and accessing capital.

### Our Impact

- **143** clients received small business support.
- **536** hours of one-on-one small business consulting strengthened local economies in East Tennessee.

In 2024-2025 Centro Hispano saw a **293% increase** in workshop participants.



### IMPACT STORY From Self-Doubt to Success: Rosalina's Transformation

Rosalina came to Centro Hispano looking for ways to strengthen her business skills, enrolling in our **Grandes Sueños, Pequeñas Empresas Business Bootcamp**. In the beginning, Rosalina was filled with self-doubt, and struggled to use the technology she would need to be successful. Still, her determination kept her moving forward. As she learned new skills, she realized that her business model was not sustainable. Instead of giving up, she stayed committed, learning how to pitch her business, share her story, and talk about her services with clarity and pride. Today, Rosalina and her business have been transformed. She feels empowered to run a sustainable small business, and remains deeply grateful for the support she received at Centro Hispano. Her journey exemplifies what becomes possible when determination, access to the right tools, and community support come together.






# INCOME AND EXPENSES
